New Willard 50

Willard Marine announces a new addition to its fleet of Willard pleasure boats. Long a builder of commercial and military vessels, Willard is no stranger to offshore boating, and the Willard 30 and 40 have proven popular with owners around the country.

This new boat, a 50-footer, looks very competent indeed. It is a ballasted, full displacement double-ender, and fits squarely in that middle ground between large passagemaker and smaller trawler cruiser.

Specs for the new boat include: LOA of 50', LWL of 46', beam of 16', and a 5' draft. The displacement at half load is 60,000 lbs, of which over 20 percent is ballast.

Standard power is a single 155-hp naturally-aspirated diesel engine. With 1,000 gallons of fuel aboard, she will cruise at 8 knots, and have a range of 2,900 NM.

Like all Willards, the boat will be a veritable floating brickhouse, with a heavy, solid-glass hull.

The Rod Swift-designed yacht has two staterooms, with master forward.

The master stateroom enjoys an island berth, ensuite head with shower/tub, and two hanging lockers.

While there could be room for a third stateroom, Willard thankfully chose to keep things more realistic, so there is space for a dedicated utility room or office.

The saloon is a widebody design, with a side deck on the starboard side of the boat.

The Willard 50 is a good example of a classic offshore boat, and will appeal to those wanting a true bluewater trawler—preferring seagoing hull shape and accommodation plan over a multilevel, maximum-volume trawler yacht with lots of staterooms for dockside living. And with Willard's reputation for heavy construction, the low profile passagemaker should make waves.
